The Problems: When Isaiah saw the holiness of the Lord, he confessed: "Woe is me! For I am an unclean man and dwell among a people of unclean lips (Isa 6:5). We cannot stand God's holiness.

His holiness evokes confession – of our total sinfulness. None of us has God within. None of us has even the tiniest spark of divinity in us.

The "Spirit of God" hymn wrongly assumes that God is within us and that we can see God's holiness in the face of others. Not so. The idea is sub-Christian, that is, a kind of New Age spirituality.

Rather, God's holiness is the cross alone. How contrary to "sweet Jesus"! The Holy One is the crucified one. He's not "nice" or "sweet." We cannot find a lovely reflection of ourselves in his crucifixion.

He died for us, the ungodly. And he was raised from the dead to be present wherever his Word and sacraments are rightly preached, that is, wherever salvation is proclaimed by faith alone in Christ alone.

What's Good about "Mary, Did you Know?"

At a time when there is so much nonsense about political correctness in general and about Mary as a feminist icon in particular, here's a modern hymn that gets it right. It focuses on Jesus' person and work – and also on Mary's role as the God-bearer.

This song invites us to look with Mary in wonder at this infant and to his future as the Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world (John 1:29).
